Tier 1 Universal Strategies for Early Childhood Learners

The Early Childhood Team for the South Carolina Department of Education's Office of Special Education Services will discuss universal strategies for early childhood learners. Created specifically for educators, this session will focus on the definition & purpose of Universal Strategies for Early Childhood, describe & model specific strategies, and provide resources to locate strategies that are needed for educators in the classroom. Participants will also be provided an introduction to the Pyramid Model framework for early childhood learners. Specifically focused on the needs of the teacher, this session will provide virtual, hands-on application, and address the most relevant concerns educators have in the classroom for early childhood learners.

Meet Your aRPy Ambassador & Learn about the DEC Recommended Practices!

As the professional association for early childhood special education, DEC provides guidance on early intervention & early childhood special education practices related to better outcomes for young children with disabilities and/or developmental delays, their families, and the personnel who serve them.
