

# Special Education Itinerant Teacher (SEIT) Academy

The SEIT Academy is a virtual continuing education series and is designed to promote and support the implementation of a special education itinerant model within early childhood programs as part of the continuum of services for preschool children with disabilities.



### SC Partnerships for Inclusion

South Carolina Partnerships for Inclusion (SCPI) is an early childhood technical assistance (TA) center focused on increasing inclusive opportunities and school readiness for preschool children with disabilities. SCPI partners with school districts to build local capacity to support all young children and their families to belong and thrive within their communities. SCPI uses a professional development model of TA, training, and ongoing support to meet the needs of districts, schools, and educators.

### SC Program for Infant/Toddler Care

The SC Program for Infant/Toddler Care (SCPITC)
Network offers training and coaching to directors and care teachers who serve children birth to 3 years old in centers or family child care homes.





### SC Inclusion Collaborative

The South Carolina Child Care Inclusion Collaborative (SCIC) provides individualized training and technical assistance for child care providers to support the inclusion of children with disabilities and developmental delays in child care programs. Our inclusion specialists work directly with child care staff and program administrators to increase the use of evidence-based practices that lead to access and meaningful participation for all children.
